- **4** 2022 saw restrictions from Covid-19 pandemic greatly eased but not every aspect returned at the beginning of 2022. Donations and cash collections continued to be received via the SumUp card reader and the links using the GiveALittle app. Church supporters were able to continue using debit cards at services, and allowed people to donate online through Facebook, and our website. Gift Aid envelopes were brought back into use from April 2022, but collection is still not taken during the service.
- **5** We are very grateful to those who made a donation to our Gift Day. As always, the generosity of our family enables us to continue our works.
- 6 Gift Aid tax recovery covers 2021 Q3 to 2021 Q4.
- **7** There were 3 Legacies received during 2022. We were advised of a legacy in May 2021 of £1,000 from the estate of the late Mrs Joy M Underhill, and this has been received in 2022. One legacy received has been registered as Restricted Funds, whereas the remaining two are listed as General Fund.
- **8** The £350 grant was from Warbleton Parish Council towards the upkeep of the churchyard, a decrease of £175 from 2021.

a) Clergy support: Council tax £3,599, Environmental charges £308, Travel, hospitality, postage, telephone £2,548.

There were no transactions with persons related to PCC members during 2022.

- 11 The Parish share to the Chichester Diocese is for the payment of Clergy and other central costs. The full cost of parish ministry amounts to £44,362. The PCC are pleased that we were able to make 100% contribution of our share.
- 12 Consecrated and benefice property is not included in the accounts in accordance with section 10(2) of the Charities Act 2011. Moveable church furnishings held by the Rector and Churchwardens on special trust for the PCC are inalienable property and are included at historical valuation.
- **13** Our investment with M&G Charified Units ended 2021 with a value of £105,411 (2020: £92,972). We note that our investments have again decreased their value during 2022, to a value of £99,539 recorded at 31 Dec 2022, a decrease of 0.06%.
- 14 Statement of funds: Restricted funds represent (a) income from trusts which may be expended only on those restricted objects provided in the terms of the trust or bequest, and (b) donations received for a specific object. The funds may only be expended on the specific object for which they were given. Any balance remaining unspent at the end of each year must be carried forward as a balance of that fund. The PCC does not usually invest separately for each fund.

Restricted funds comprise:

Darnell and Southam Trusts for repairs to the fabric of the Church

Bells Appeal for the renovation and maintenance of the bells

Missions - Offerings earmarked for other charities

Rev E Haviland for maintenance and enhancement of the Church

Unrestricted funds are general funds, which can be used for PCC ordinary purposes. They are not subject to any donor restrictions and can be spent as the PCC decides.

Independent Examiner's Report to the PCC of St Mary the Virgin

This is my report to the Parochial Church Council (PCC) of St Mary the Virgin Warbleton, on the annual report for the year ended 31st December 2022 set out on pages 1 to 5.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The PCC members are responsible for the preparation of the annual reports. The PCC members consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144 of the Charities Act 2011 ("the Charities Act") and that an independent examination is needed.

It is my responsibility to:

- 1. examine the accounts under section 145 of the Charities Act,
- 2. to follow the procedures laid down in the general Directions given by the Charity Commission (under section 145(5)(b) of the Charities Act, and
- 3. to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination was carried out in accordance with general Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair' view and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below.

Independent examiner's statement
