#### From The Rectory

The recently sacked Home Secretary, Suella Braverman, caused controversy, amongst other things, by Tweeting (are we meant to call it X-ing, now?) that: "The British people are compassionate. We will always support those who are genuinely homeless. But we cannot allow our streets to be taken over by rows of tents occupied by people, many of them from abroad, living on the streets as a lifestyle choice."



The Matt cartoon in The Daily Telegraph quipped that the message in Suella Braverman's Christmas Card might say that "being born in a stable is a lifestyle choice". I think Christians would agree!

Luke's gospel tells us that the Emperor Augustus had issued a decree that a census should be taken. So Joseph and his betrothed, Mary, had gone from their town of Nazareth in Galilee to register in Bethlehem, the town which great King David of old had been from, because Joseph was of the house and line of David. While they were there, Mary gave birth to Jesus and placed him in a manger because there was no room for them in the inn. But the circumstances of Jesus' birth were more than the result of

historical accidents. The Bible sees them as the fulfilment of God's plan and of the prophecies that the long-promised Rescuer-King would be born in Bethlehem, the city of his ancestor King David.

In a sense, the Son of God could have remained in heaven without blame. But for him to be born in a stable was a lifestyle choice. He came to our broken world and shared our mess that he might be our Saviour. The Bible says that Jesus did not consider equality with God something to cling on to but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being found in human likeness. He did not leave the glory of heaven for a splendid earthly palace. As the Carol says, a stable-place sufficed for the Lord God Almighty Jesus Christ. The Bread of Life was placed in an animal's feeding trough. Eventually he would die on the cross in our place that our sins might be forgiven.

As another hymn addressed to the Lord Jesus puts it:

Thou who wast rich beyond all splendour, All for love's sake becamest poor; Thrones for a manger didst surrender, Sapphire-paved courts for stable floor. Thou who wast rich beyond all splendour, All for love's sake becomes poor.

Indeed, John's Gospel tells us that Jesus The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. Literally he pitched his tent, or tabernacled amongst us. In Old Testament times, when God's people were travelling through the desert to the promised land, they worshiped God in a tent, The Tabernacle. And during his earthly ministry, Jesus was an embodied Tabernacle, a kind of mobile walking talking Temple. Jesus was the place to go to meet with God, where the glory of God was revealed. Jesus' own body would be the place of sacrifice by which sinners like me and you could come into the presence of a holy God.

Soon Jesus and his family would be refugees as they fled from the murderous King Herod to the safety of Egypt. Later, speaking of himself, Jesus would say: ""Foxes have dens and birds have nests, but the Son of Man has no place to lay his head." Jesus was made homeless and chose to dwell in the tent of human flesh that we might come home to God.

# Mission Support for December St. Matthew's School, Cyangugu, Rwanda

St. Matthew's School was founded in 1998 by the Diocese of Cyangugu to provide English speaking education for orphans of the genocide living in that area, at primary level. The quality of the education provided has meant that over the years more and more parents have wanted their children to attend and so the school has continued to grow. In 2010 the secondary school was started and in 2019 St. Matthew's was asked to establish a second campus at Nyamasheke nearby. The pupils now number 1,502 supported by a team of dedicated people, teachers and administrative staff plus non-teaching staff.

The Vision of the School. "To equip students with a distinctive and responsive education, to be transformed with a heart for Christ".

Benson Muramira, the headteacher has sent us a report of the schools recent activities and needs. Academically, he says, both schools follow the national curriculum and are ahead in national exams, receiving certificates of merit in their districts. Sports play an important part in the activities along with study trips and two chaplains attend to the spiritual needs of the pupils.

Many of the children come from less privileged families. These can be helped with their school fees and a school feeding programme is in place. All children get breakfast and lunch at school which in some cases is much needed but dramatically increased food prices are affecting the school's ability to fund this.

Another problem is the big increase in pupil numbers this academic year. Government officials, writes the Headteacher, have told the school to provide four more classrooms at Rusizi campus and three more at Nyamasheke in order to accommodate the children according to government requirements, a serious financial challenge.

The report concludes with heartfelt thanks to the schools founders and supporters, in particular Bishop Kenneth Barham, the leadership of the Diocese of Cyangugu and all friends of the schools including Warbleton church. "St. Matthew's staff pledges its continuous efforts towards nurturing highly knowledgeable future Rwandan leaders". We will support the ongoing work of these two schools this month with our giving and with our prayers.

# Churchwardens in the 17<sup>th</sup> & 18<sup>th</sup> Century Wealden Parishes by Paula Nicholson

Whilst there are records of the vicars and rectors of our Sussex parishes, the churchwardens who did so much to keep things ticking over merited little press coverage. Last month, I drew upon the comprehensive work of Elizabeth Doff in her PhD thesis - Social conditions in the Cuckmere Valley 1660-1780: the influence of church and dissent. In that, she outlined the important role of churchwardens in this area of the High Weald.

Churchwardens ranged from quite humble and upright souls doing their best to administer relief to the poor and ensure the fabric of the church was in good order, to others who may well have taken advantage of the position to acquire not only upward social mobility but a goodly income. In 1674, John Turner, the outgoing churchwarden of Warbleton was involved in a spat with the new one, when accused of not handing over the parish accounts. Turner was so miffed that he refused to attend church but that backfired when he was reported for non-attendance. The conflict between them lasted for fifteen years, including Turner being accused of drunkenness and blasphemy at the Archdeanery Court of Lewes. Interestingly, one of Turner's accusers seemed to have ascended the social mobility ladder throughout these years, becoming the Reeve<sup>2</sup> and rent collector for the Manor of Warbleton and amassing enough money to buy Pilley Farm in 1693. Ms Doff surmises that the ex-churchwarden and reeve Samuel Store had "exploited his position." However, he does appear to have been a successful businessman as well.

Whatever, it was a pretty onerous task being a churchwarden. Whilst it was usual to hold the post for only two years, the responsibility was too much for some. The job description was pretty demanding, nor was it likely to endear you to many of your neighbours. Firstly, the administration of relief to the poor meant that you were as popular as a clerk in the present Department of Work & Pensions. Secondly, the responsibility of collecting taxes and tithes to pay for the poor and the upkeep of the church likened you to a HMRC tax collector. On top of that, you had the responsibility of grassing to the church on the misdemeanours and immoral behaviour of your neighbours; a bit like being a rural STASI official. That might have explained why, fifteen men held the post in eight years in early 17<sup>th</sup> century Berwick.

Turning away from the social security tasks, the churchwardens were responsible for the upkeep of the church, its bells and its assets. That included "various artifacts, vestments, vessels and linens "(for the communion table), the chest holding the parish documents and also displaying the Ten Commandments, the Creed and the Lord's Prayer." To pay for the upkeep of the church, the wardens had to get donations from the parishioners. That wasn't too easy in some parishes and failure opened up the risk of punishment. In 1708, two churchwardens in Heathfield were threatened with ex-communication as they hadn't managed to get the bells repaired for a long time.

The church would check up from time to time to ensure that the church was in good condition and the churchwardens had things under control. In 1686, John Lake, the Bishop of Chichester commissioned a survey of the Wealden churches. Only West Dean was "omnia bene," or all OK. At Warbleton, the seats were not judged to be in good order. Some parishes got around the problem of rotting pews by charging for them – a family would have its own pew. Quarrels would occur if one sat in the wrong pew, but a way around that was to label them. Or you could build your own pew<sup>3</sup> as in the unusual raised one in the north aisle of Warbleton church erected in 1722 by the owners of Stone House. By the time of the next survey was commissioned by Bishop Bowers in 1724 all was found to be in good repair. Maybe the wealth generated by the local iron industry had something to do with that.

By the 18<sup>th</sup> century the majority of churchwardens were gentlemen, tradesmen and landowners. With their social standing it is likely that they had an easier job than the earlier post holders, but it is more likely they contributed a lot of the funds themselves.





# St John the Evangelist Bodle Street Green



#### Julian of Norwich

Do you listen to "In Our Time" with Melvin Bragg on Radio 4? The topics can feel out of our time and obscure, like to finer points of Aristotle's Ethics (which was last week's subject), or they can be exciting and stimulating, as was the case when the subject was Julian of Norwich.

Julian of Norwich, a woman, was born in 1343, the same year as Geoffrey Chaucer. That is relevant because, like Chaucer, she didn't write in scholarly Latin or aristocratic French, but in English, the first female writer of English who's writing has survived. Middle English, that is, so most of us have to read her work in a modern translation, and probably very few people did read it before it was transcribed and translated in 1901.

Her book is called "Revelations of Divine Love" and is a spiritual meditation on Christ and Christ's Crucifixion. "A Book of Showings to the Anchoress Julian of Norwich" is a lees snappy, but more accurate title. Her revelations or "showings" happened on May 13<sup>th</sup> 1373 after a near-death experience when the priest who had come to give her the Last Rites held a crucifix before her face and she imagined blood streaming from it. She recorded this life-changing event and sixteen subsequent revelations in a Short Text, which she then enlarged and expanded over many years of study and thought to produce her final book, the Long Text, remarkably and lovingly preserved by a group of nuns. The manuscript and nuns escaped to France at the English Reformation. The manuscript returned to England again at the onset of the French Revolution.

The fourteenth century was a turbulent time. he Black Death arrived in England in 1348, killing up to one third of the population. The Peasants Revolt in 1381. The Hundred years War with France. Julian was able to concentrate on her inner life by becoming an anchoress in a cell attached to St Julian's Church, Norwich. (She may well have taken her name from this church's dedication.) The church and cell were damaged by bombs in the Second World War, but were restored, and can be, and are, visited today. Permission from the Bishop of Norwich was needed before Julian could take her anchoritic vows, and a special service was held. The service was the funeral service, because, as an anchoress, Julian was now dead to this world. She became an anchoress in 1390 and her actual death was in 1416.

What makes her Revelations special and loved by people today? Her optimism: Despite death and war she was able to say "all shall be well, all shall be well, and all manner of things shall be well." Words chosen to be written on the late Queen's Jubilee window at St James' Palace. Words needed more than ever today. Her vision: She was able to imagine the whole of creation in a nutshell. "And in this he showed a little thing, the quantity of a hazelnut, lying in the palm of my hand, as me seemed, and it was as round as a ball. I looked thereon with the eye of my understanding, and thought: What may this be? And it was answered generally thus: It is all that is made. I marvelled how it might last, for me thought it might suddenly have fallen to nought for littleness. And I was answered in my understanding: It lasteth and ever shall, for God loveth it; and so hath all thing being by the love of God."

In a patriarchal society Julian called Jesus mother. "And thus is Jesu our very mother in kind of our first making, and he is our very mother in grace." The Trinity represents all genders. "For the first I saw and understood that the high might of the Trinity is our father, and the deep wisdom of the Trinity is our mother, and the great love of the Trinity is our lord, and all these we have in kind and in our substantial making." Thoughts and visions like these, written five hundred years ago by a woman closeted in a single room beside a small church in Norwich, now inspire men and women throughout the Christian world.


